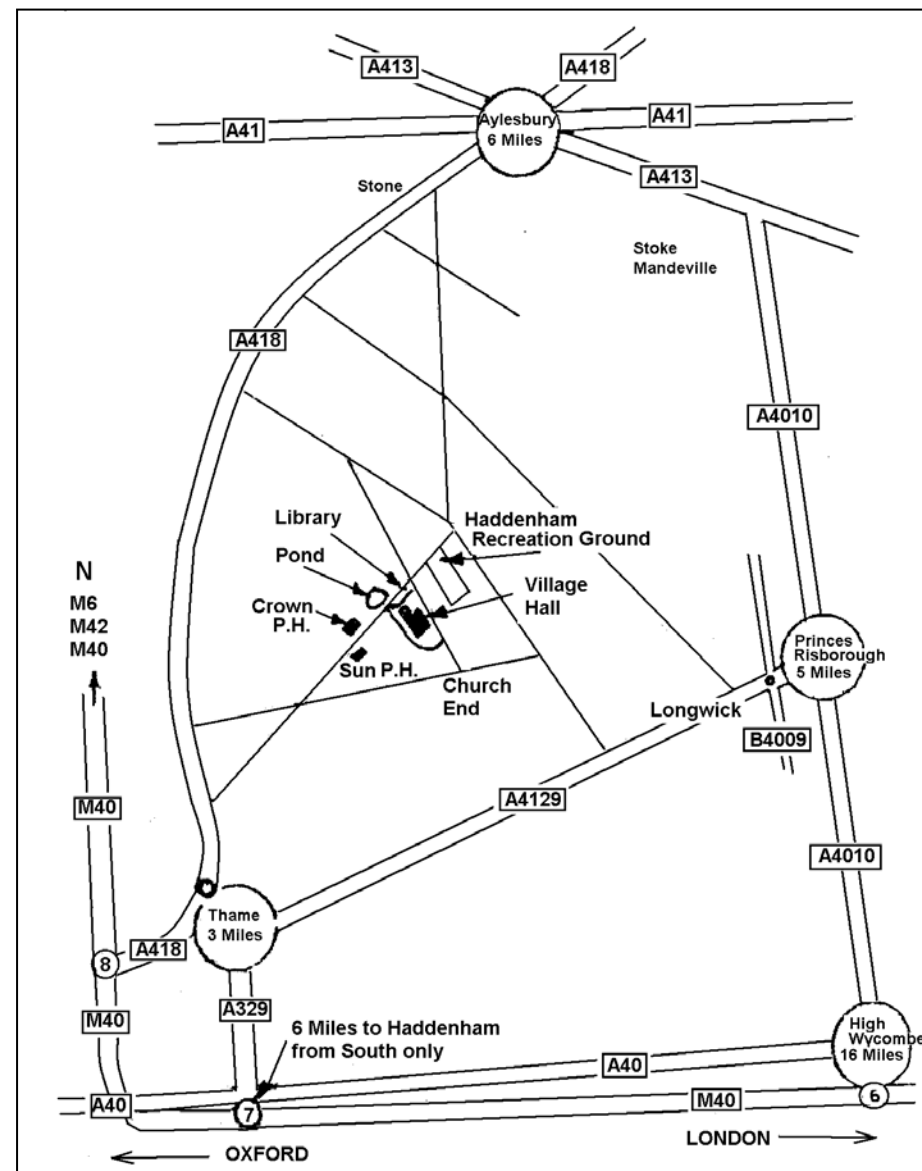

- Racing Whippets must have a valid WCRA Passport with a current (2014) sticker
- Lure Coursing Whippets must be registered with a Lure Coursing Club
- Name of Racing/Lure Coursing Club to be stated on the entry form.
- The Racing/Lure Coursing judge will judge the unbeaten line-up of the R/LC classes to produce a Best Dog, Best Bitch, Best Veteran Dog & Best Veteran Bitch. , These exhibits will be eligible to challenge for Best in Show, Best Veteran in Show, Reserve Best in Show, Best Opposite Sex, Best Dog, Best Bitch, Reserve Best Dog, Reserve Best Bitch, Best Veteran Dog and Best Veteran Bitch, if still unbeaten within the overall show. Under K.C. Rules a dog that is entered in both Show and R/LC Classes cannot be withdrawn from any class within the show, so as to remain unbeaten. Best in Show and subsequent awards will be judged by the Show Judge and the Racing/Lure Coursing Judge
- The best Racing/Lure Coursing exhibit will be chosen by the R/LC Judge after Best in Show has been chosen, provided Best in Show has not been awarded to an exhibit from the R/LC classes
- Best Puppy in show will be judged by the Show Judge
- The same Whippet cannot enter a Special Racing class and a Special Lure Coursing class as well, but must be confined to one or the other
- The Special Lure Coursing classes are for Whippets which have won a class/course at a recognised Lure Coursing meeting, where the class or course was specifically for Whippets

RULES and REGULATIONS

- The show will open at 8.30 a.m.
- Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that dogs are available for judging when required.
- Judging will commence at 9.30 a.m.
- Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the show management
- Entry fees** : First entry £4.00 per dog all subsequent entries with same dog £1.50 Not for Competition £1.50 per dog Membership Fees £8.00, single £1.00 Joint, Catalogues £2.00 pre-paid, Advertisements £6.00 full page, £4.50 half page
- Prize Money**. First £4.00, Second £3.00, Third £2.00, Reserve £1.00, BIS £20, RBIS £15, BPIS £10, BVIS £10, BR/LCIS £10
- The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries..
- Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition
- The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden
- Best Puppy in Show** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled, the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of the Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and are unbeaten by any other puppy.
Withdrawal from Competition Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate, in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition
Proviso For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
- Best in Show** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
Withdrawal from Competition Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition
Proviso For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
- Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with permission of the Show Management
- Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- All exhibitors must be familiar with the Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition)
- All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor

17. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

Please take care of your dog.

If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

18. Not for competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club Registered
19. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible
20. The Committee will not be held responsible for the entire or partial loss or injury to any dog, or to any property whatsoever, whether arising from accident or from any other cause or from any act or omission of themselves, their officers, agents or others and entries are only accepted on this understanding.
21. Should any Judge being prevented from fulfilling his/her engagement, the Committee reserve the right to appoint another Judge to fulfil their duties
22. The Committee can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stand holders at this show and remind exhibitors grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition
23. Any owner, Competitor or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any litter, loose hair or fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club Licensed Show within the Licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches
24. Joint Membership is available to Husband and Wife or Partners. Entry to the show by partners at Membership rates is applicable to dogs owned in partnership when both partners are members, Dogs independently owned must be entered by individual members.

ATTRACTION OF EXHIBITS F(1) 17h

The attracting of attention of exhibits by any method from outside the ring is prohibited. It is the duty of the Judge, Steward or Show Management noticing such attraction to ask that it cease.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the show are not eligible for exhibition

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' Classes or competing for Members' Specials, each partner must, at the time of entry, be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class, i.e. **Tuesday 8th December 2015.**

Wins in Variety Classes do not count for entry in Breed Classes, but when entering for Variety Classes, wins in both Breed and Variety Classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a special prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

- 1 **Withdrawal:** the dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 9(j) and 20.
- 2 **Transfer:**
 - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height, or in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty-four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or Height and in the event of their being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height..
 - c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - d) If any exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

Minor Puppy: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the show
Puppy: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show

Junior: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the show

Maiden For dogs which have not won a First prize at any Show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy Classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

Novice: For dogs which have not won three or more First prizes at any Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy Classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

Graduate For dogs which have not won four or more First prizes at Open or Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not

Post Graduate: For dogs which have not won five or more First prizes at Open and Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not

Limit: For dogs which have not won seven or more First Prizes in all, at Open and Championship Shows in Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not

Open: For all dogs of the breed s for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show.
Veteran For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the show

RACING & LURE COURSING CLASSES

Special Open Open to all Whippets that have won a race or lure course at a WCRA affiliated club or recognised Lure Coursing Club in the last twenty four months. Club and qualifying event to be stated on the entry form

Special Yearling Open to Whippets of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Whippets to have won a race or lure course at a WCRA affiliated club or recognised Lure Coursing Club in the last eighteen months. Club and qualifying event to be stated on the entry form

Special Veteran, Racing or Lure Coursing Open to Whippets which are not less than seven years of age on the first day of the show. Whippets to have raced or lure coursed with a WCRA affiliated club or recognised Lure Coursing Club, where they have won a race or lure course in the last twenty four months. Club and qualifying event to be stated on the entry form

Special Winners, Racing or Lure Coursing Racing exhibits to have been WCRA Championship finalists or Open Weight Group Winners at an open meeting at which WCRA Superstars points were awarded in the last two years, Lure Coursing exhibits to have won a Best in Breed or Best in Field in the last two years

Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition F (Annex B)

1. These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these show regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these regulation will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there at
 - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42
2.
 - a) No substance, which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat, may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance, which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog, may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
 - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition
3. No act or operation which alters the natural confirmation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee
 - b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed
 - c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered would be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. Any individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
